Transportation and Maintenance Center Ribbon Cutting and Grand Opening

Leadership from both the county and schools, staff, community members, school board members and county supervisors gathered on the afternoon of September 25th to commemorate the grand opening of the recently purchased and renovated Transportation and Maintenance Center in Oilville, VA.

Originally proposed by citizen, “Buzz” Coe, the concept of purchasing the facility was discussed by both the school and county boards and eventually a proposal was developed by the school division leadership. “Addressing the transportation facility needs has been part of the capital planning discussions for many years,” commented Assistant Superintendent of Business Operations, Peter Gretz.

The new facility includes additional bus bay space and about double the overall square footage as well as improved ventilation and lighting. “The mechanics used to have to the deflate bus tires to get the vehicles into the old bays,” explained Transportation Supervisor Betty Thurston. “They are now working in a professional and safe environment.”
